Statement from the diocese on vaccines:

There is no Covid-19 vaccine vet that has received US Food & Drug Administration (FDA) approval, and the three vaccines that have received emergency use authorization by the FDA are not morally irreproachable due to their use of abortion-derived cell lines in some phase of vaccine design, production, or testing. The Johnson & Johnson/Janssen vaccine is the most morally compromised with the use of abortion-derived cell lines in its production process. The Pfizer and Moderna vaccines used abortion-derived cell lines only in the testing phase. Thus, you are strongly encouraged to avoid the Johnson & Johnson/Janssen vaccine if you have the option to choose one of the other currently-available vaccines. In the current environment, it is morally acceptable for individuals to choose to receive any of the currently available vaccines without moral guilt, with this strong moral preference for choosing the Pfizer and Moderna vaccines based on choosing the lesser evil, and while doing so under protest, and assessing significant factors, including any individual limitation to choose among the currently-available vaccines. Individuals may be led for serious reasons to refuse in good-faith any currently available vaccine due to religious, safety, or personal reasons, even in light of the proper Christian concern for public health, the common good, and concern for the most vulnerable amid the presence of a contagious disease.
