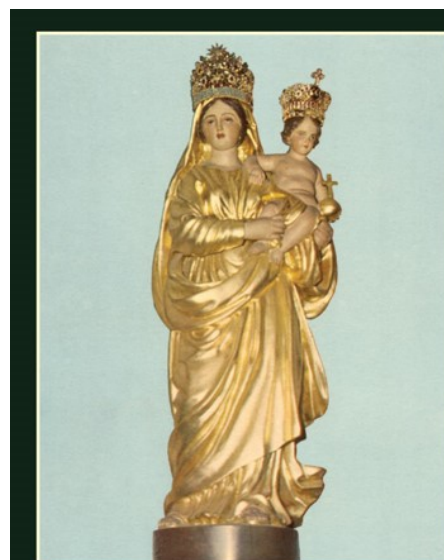

Q: Hey Bulletin Lady, what does the Feast of the Holy Family celebrate? Don't Mary and Joseph already have their own feast days?

A: Great question! Although major feast days dedicated to each member of the Holy Family— Jesus, Mary, and Joseph —also exist, the Feast of the Holy Family commemorates their life together, and the celebration focuses on religious family life.

More from EWTN: This feast day honors Jesus, the Blessed Mother, and St. Joseph as the holiest of families, and therefore a model for all Christians families. They were holy because they placed God at the center of their family life, they loved and sacrificed for one another, and they radiated that love to others in the redemptive mission of the Word Incarnate.

Pope St. John Paul II said, "The Redeemer of the world chose the family as the place for his birth and growth, thereby sanctifying this fundamental institution of every society" (Angelus message, 30 Dec. 2001).
